ENCOURAGING WORDS

What's the Big Deal?

Sometimes we mistakenly think of the magnitude of sins in a wrong way. We talk of "little" sins as being those which really do not "count" because they seem so innocent when compared to major blunders which only the most ungodly do. The Catholic Church even has the same view of sins which are characterized as <u>venial</u> and <u>mortal</u> sins. A *venial sin* is a lesser *sin* that does not result in a complete separation from God and eternal damnation in Hell as an unrepented mortal *sin* would.

When one believes that, he struggles to figure out how eating fruit from a tree in the Garden of Eden could be so wrong. How could such an "innocent" act be compared to the sin mentioned in the next chapter where a brother kills his own brother? Surely, murder must be a greater sin that eating a piece of fruit. Our view of "little" and "big" sins is often so wrong!

While the Bible does not use these words to describe sin. It does speak of "full grown" sins.

Jas. 1:13-15— When tempted, no one should say "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does he tempt anyone, but each person is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evil desire and enticed. Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death."

We often fail to realize that <u>any sin</u> can become an addiction. Peter describes this process when he talked about Christians escaping the pollution of sin through following Christ, but then are "again entangled in it and are overcome and are worse off at the end than they were at the beginning. Sin has remarkable power! Joseph was enticed by Potiphar's wife and he ran! Have he stayed he might have fallen to the bondage of sin. David, on the other hand, was tempted and did not run. Look at the ruin his action, or lack of bought to life and family!

"Little" sins My seem rather innocent when we are first enticed by them, but always remember, yielding to "little sins" from a heart set on ignoring God opens the door to the bondage of sin! When we sin, we must repent and not let it become "full-grown."
