## FOOD FOR THOUGHT

As Paul was explaining how the wisdom of man is inferior to the wisdom of God and how man needed to seek his fulfillment in Christ, he observed that “Jews request a **sign**, and Greeks seek after **wisdom**; but we preach **Christ** crucified” (1 Cor.1:22-23). Then, he showed them that what they were seeking could only be found in what he was preaching. To the Jews who seek a “sign”, Christ is “the **power** of God,” and to the Greeks who seek “wisdom,” Christ is “the **wisdom** of God” (1:24). Why don’t more people seek their fulfillment in Christ?

Today, folks are trying to “find themselves.” Have they looked to Christ? Folks are wanting to know “what their purpose is.” Have they looked to Christ? Folks are looking for “the meaning of life.” Have they looked to Christ? That is why Paul said, “For I determined not to know anything among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified” (2:2). When Christ is the one who “fills all in all” (Eph. 1:23)

## ENCOURAGING WORDS

### How Did That Turn Out?

Who has not had that period in their life where the darkest clouds surrounded them, and the raging storm threatened them? Who has not been filled with anxiety and felt like Luke, who described the storm he shared with Paul on the apostle’s voyage to Rome...When neither sun nor stars appeared for many days and the storm continued raging, we finally gave up hope of being saved. (**Acts 27:20**) All hope seemed to be lost; it seemed like a hopeless situation!

The complete story of Paul’s shipwreck can totally change how we view adversity. Without God, life can be hopeless. This is true for most people, but what about God’s people, is there ever a hopeless situation? Here are a couple of stories given to us by God to see how apparent “hopeless situation” can be turned into great blessings for the lives of others.

Ask Joseph about his life— hated by his brothers; their desire to kill a dreamer; sold as a slave; bought by Potiphar whose wife hated Joseph so much that her lies resulted in his imprisonment. Isn’t that a hopeless situation? Now ask Joseph later in life, “How did that turn out”?

Ask the jailor in Philippi about that nightmare when in the middle of the night an earthquake freed all his prisoners. Ask him how hopeless he felt as he was ready to take his own life. Ask him just hours later, “How did that turn out”? Ask him about the joy he had when he shared a meal with his family and newfound friends. There is always hope with God!

Now lets make the application of these stories to our lives. A life viewed without God may seem hopeless, but just remember how these and many other stories turned out. There is always hope with God!
